GENERAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT (GED) EXAMINATION

- I. The Board of School Trustees of a school district may, upon request and for good cause shown, grant permission to take the tests of general educational development (GED) to a person who:
 - A. Resides in the school district;
 - B. Is at least 16 years of age, but less than 17 years of age;
 - C. Submits to the Board of School Trustees written permission signed by a parent or legal guardian;
 - D. Has not graduated from a high school;
 - E. Is not currently enrolled in a high school; and
 - F. Satisfies any other requirements prescribed by the Board of School Trustees.
- II. The Superintendent, or his designee, is authorized to receive written requests with parental permission for 16 year-olds to take the GED. Requests shall be made through the adult education office.
- III. In addition to items A-E above, all students will be required to complete a mandatory counseling session with an adult education counselor to discuss the consequences of taking the GED test.
- IV. Permission to take the GED shall be granted by the Superintendent or his designee, to individuals who meet the requirements enumerated above.
- V. Persons who are 17 years of age or older do not require permission to take the GED test. They may contact the adult education office.
