Position Summary

Under general supervision, plans, organizes, manages, and supervises the daily logistical operations/staff of the Food Service Department warehouse including receipt, inspection, storage, distribution, loading, and delivery of supplies, and route planning.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

The list of Essential Duties and Responsibilities is not exhaustive and may be supplemented.

- Plans delivery routes using a computerized routing system, monitors routes daily, and makes necessary adjustments to routes to correct for overloads, lateness, and related problems.
- Confers with warehouse management to determine overall product quantities to be shipped.
- 3. Supervises truck loadings to ensure proper delivery sequence, space utilization and load balance, product damage prevention, quality, and cleanliness.
- 4. Routes and dispatches trucks for deliveries and transfers of supplies, freight, foods, materials, equipment, and mail.
- 5. Verifies the accuracy of quantity, condition, labeling, and address information to ensure consistency with shipping invoices; resolves shipment discrepancies.

- 6. Checks daily truck reports for proper completion and usage.
- 7. Monitors and evaluates the efficiency and effectiveness of service delivery methods and procedures; implements new operational practices, as appropriate.
- 8. Oversees the compliance activities, documentation, records and reporting required to maintain regulatory compliance and performance monitoring relative to logistical operations and fleet maintenance.
- May drive any truck or tractor-trailer combination as permitted with a Class A
 Commercial Driver's License for short distances on public streets and may hook
 and unhook trailers.
- 10. Operates a forklift, hand truck, pallet jack, and electric cart to load/unload delivery vehicles.
- 11. Plans, organizes, and manages operations related to the planning, budgeting, procurement, maintenance, repair, and parts management of the Food Service Department's fleet and associated equipment.
- 12. Develops operations and maintenance policies and procedures.
- 13. Develops and administers fleet asset management and inventory plans.
- 14. Identifies fleet resource optimization opportunities and implementation strategies; sets goals, develops performance metrics, and provides specialized reporting on fleet activities.
- 15. Maintains knowledge of industry best-practices, trends, regulations, and innovations; provides recommendations to the department's administrative team regarding the feasibility of such practices.
- 16. Investigates accidents/incidents to obtain information (i.e., photographs, measurements, diagrams, accident re-construction, etc.) for documentation and to prepare reports/forms for Clark County School District departments and other agencies.
- 17. Provides leadership and works with staff to ensure a high-performance, customer service oriented work environment that supports the department's mission and goals.
- 18. Applies process improvement and quality management principles to assigned areas of responsibility.
- 19. Develops training and safety programs.
- 20. Organizes and oversees the schedules and work of staff, as assigned.
- 21. Hires and supervises staff responsible for all logistics functions.
- 22. Conducts performance evaluations that are timely and constructive.
- 23. Handles discipline of employees as needed and in accordance with applicable District policies.
- 24. Maintains compliance with occupational safety regulations and labor agreements.
- 25. Conforms to safety standards, as prescribed.

Distinguishing Characteristics

This is a supervisory classification that oversees and directs logistical operations and fleet management within the Food Service Department, including utilizing a computerized routing system to plan, coordinate, and supervise the loading and routing of temperature-controlled food and supplies.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities (Position Expectations)

- 1. Knowledge of the principles, practices, and techniques of logistical operations and fleet maintenance/management.
- Knowledge of occupational safety regulations, safe work practices, safety
 equipment related to the work performed, Occupational Safety and Health
 Administration (OSHA) regulations, safety procedures, and Hazard Analysis
 Critical Control Point (HACCP).
- 3. Knowledge of state, local, and federal laws and other governmental regulations that affect and govern commercial motor vehicles and fleet maintenance operations.
- 4. Knowledge of management principles, supervisory practices and procedures, and customer service principles and techniques.
- 5. Excellent analytical skills.
- 6. Knowledge of principles and techniques of route scheduling.
- 7. Ability to perform multiple tasks and a variety of duties.
- 8. Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- 9. Proficient with computer-based management systems for inventory control, shipping operations, fleet management, and fulfillment services.
- Proficient with Microsoft Office Suite, Google Workspace, and/or similar programs.
- 11. Ability to develop and apply procedures.
- 12. Ability to train employees.
- 13. Ability to plan and organize work.
- 14. Ability to investigate and resolve problems.
- 15. Ability to coordinate activities with schools and departments.
- 16. Ability to meet predetermined deadlines.
- 17. Ability to work flexible hours or shifts.

- 18. Ability to make quick and accurate decisions.
- 19. Ability to effectively work under pressure with frequent interruptions.
- 20. Ability to work effectively with District personnel.
- 21. Ability to operate basic office equipment (i.e., computer terminals, printers, copy machines, telephone systems, facsimile machines, etc.).
- 22. Ability to recognize and report hazards and apply safe work methods.
- 23. Ability to operate powered pallet jack, fork truck, and reach truck.
- 24. Possess physical and mental stamina commensurate with the responsibilities of the position.

Position Requirements

Education, Training, and Experience

- 1. High school graduation or other equivalent (i.e., General Education Development (GED), foreign equivalency, etc.).
- Five (5) years of progressively responsible supervisory experience in truck operations, with responsibility for or participation in checking, coordinating, dispatching, loading, and unloading supplies and equipment on trucks and trailers.

Licenses and Certifications

- 1. A valid Class A commercial driver's license that allows the applicant/employee to legally operate a motor vehicle in Nevada. If valid Class A commercial driver's license is not in possession at the time of application, a valid driver's license that allows the applicant/employee to legally operate a motor vehicle in Nevada must be in possession and the Class A commercial license must be obtained within five (5) months of hire date. License must be maintained for the duration of the assignment.
- Copy of current driving history (dated within six (6) months from the date printed)
 issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) at time of application or
 Qualified Selection Pool (QSP) placement and at time of interview prior to final
 selection.
- 3. Hold or be able to obtain forklift qualification card from the Clark County School District. If qualification card is not in possession at time of application or QSP request, it must be obtained within five (5) months of hire into position. Qualification card must be maintained for the duration of the assignment.

Applicants/employees are subject to all aspects of mandatory drug and/or alcohol tests as required by law and/or Clark County School District regulations and procedures.

Preferred Qualifications

- 1. OSHA 30-hour General Industry Outreach Training completion card.
- Certified in Logistics, Transportation and Distribution (CLTD) or Certification in Transportation and Logistics (CTL).

Document(s) Required at Time of Application

- 1. High school transcript or other equivalent (i.e., GED, foreign equivalency, etc.).
- 2. A valid Class A Commercial driver's license that allows the applicant/employee to legally operate a motor vehicle in Nevada.
- 3. Copy of current driving history (dated within six (6) months from the date printed) issued by the DMV.
- 4. Forklift qualification card, if applicable.
- 5. Specific documented evidence of training and experience to satisfy qualifications.

Examples of Assigned Work Areas

Clark County School District - Schools and other District facilities.

Work Environment

Strength

Light/medium - exerts force of 10-20 lbs., constantly; 20-50 lbs., frequently; and 50-100 lbs., occasionally.

Physical Demand

Frequent sitting, standing, walking, pushing, pulling, stooping, kneeling, crouching, reaching, handling, and repetitive fine motor activities. Hearing and speech to communicate in person, via video conference and computers, or over the telephone. Mobility to work in a typical office setting and use standard office equipment. Stamina to remain seated and to maintain concentration for an extended period of time. Vision: Frequent near acuity, occasional far acuity, and color vision. Vision to read printed and online materials, a Video Display Terminal (VDT) screen, or other monitoring devices.

Environmental Conditions

Varies from a climate-controlled office setting, walk-in freezers, to work outdoors with temperatures ranging from mild/moderate to extreme cold/heat. Exposure to noise levels ranging from moderate to loud for occasional to frequent time periods.

Hazards

Frequent electrical shock hazards. Furniture, playground/office equipment, communicable diseases, chemicals and fumes (as related to specific assignment), and power/hand-operated equipment and machinery (as related to specific assignment

Examples of Equipment/Supplies Used to Perform Tasks

Various District-issued/personal vehicles, various computers and software applications, telephones, fax machines, copy machines, two (2)-way radios, hydraulic lift-gates, trailers with refrigerated units, forklifts, pallet jacks (electric), ladders, hand trucks, etc.
