Position Summary

Under general supervision, produces and directs educational/public interest television programs for broadcast.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

This list of Essential Duties and Responsibilities is not exhaustive and may be supplemented.

- 1. Produces/conducts television program rehearsals and broadcasts.
- 2. Coordinates/directs cast, crew, and equipment operations for productions.
- 3. Operates camera and sound equipment as required for live broadcasts.
- 4. Participates in the set design process.
- 5. Corresponds with federal, state, Clark County School District, and community representatives, as well as the public, regarding broadcast issues.
- 6. Adjusts overhead studio and field lighting as required for broadcasting purposes.
- 7. Produces and writes scripts for television program broadcasts.
- 8. Supervises and researches data collection, educational/community information, and news items for broadcasts.
- 9. Edits audio and video.
- 10. Plans and directs television programs for broadcast.
- 11. Operates various District vehicles.
- 12. Conforms to safety standards, as prescribed.

13. Performs other tasks related to the position, as assigned.

Distinguishing Characteristics

Writes, produces, hosts, and directs educational television programs.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities (Position Expectations)

- 12. Ability to accurately interpret, explain, and apply written/verbal instructions.
- 13. Ability to communicate clearly, both verbally and in writing.
- 14. Ability to work cooperatively with employees, other agencies, and the public.
- 15. Ability to recognize/report hazards and apply safe work methods.
- 16. Possess physical and mental stamina commensurate with the responsibilities of the position.

- 3. Safe driving record, which must be maintained for the duration of the assignment.

Work Environment

Strength

Light - exert force up to 20 lbs., occasionally; 10 lbs., frequently; or negligible force constantly.

Physical Demand

Frequent reaching, handling. Occasional repetitive fine motor activities. Constant talking and hearing. Hearing and speech to communicate in person, via video conference and computers, or over the telephone. Mobility to work in a typical office setting and use standard office equipment. Stamina to remain seated and maintain concentration for an extended period of time. Vision: frequent near and far acuity, occasional depth perception, focal length change, color vision and peripheral vision. Vision to read printed and online materials, Video Display Terminal (VDT) screens or other monitoring devices.

Environmental Conditions

Varies from climate-controlled office settings to work outdoors in varied weather. Moderate noise intensity levels.

Hazards

Furniture, playground/office equipment, communicable diseases, chemicals and fumes (as related to specific assignment), and power/hand-operated equipment and machinery (as related to specific assignment.)
