

What is Response to Instruction?



The purpose of RTI is to improve learning outcomes for all students.

Essential Elements of RTI

• Assessment Guides instruction for every student.

- **Multi-Level System of Support** Provides a continuum of instructional support.
- Data-Based Decision Making Assists in planning for student success by monitoring and analyzing student data.
- Collaborative Problem Solving Includes identifying, monitoring, and evaluating instruction and intervention.

What does RTI look like?

The CCSD RTI Framework uses three levels or tiers of support for all students in pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade. Throughout the tiers of support, all students are provided access to grade-level curriculum and behavioral supports.

Tier I supports all students. Emphasis is placed on the delivery of high-quality, standard-based instruction that is differentiated to meet the needs of students.

Tier II supports students who are not responding adequately to Tier I instruction.

Tier III supports students who demonstrate ongoing lack of sufficient progress or growth.



What do I do if I have concerns about my child's progress?



- Communicate regularly with your child's teacher.
- Review and help your child with his/her homework assignments.
- Request regular progress monitoring reports and participate in conferences and other meetings.
- Learn about the curriculum, assessments, and interventions being used at the school.
- Make a list of questions to ask at parent meetings (e.g., Is my child successful? How do I know? If not, why? What additional supports may be needed?).
