JOHN CANNON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - The National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences will award one \$40,000 (\$10,000 each year) college scholarship and nine \$ 1,000 onetime scholarships to high school seniors planning to pursue a career in television or a related field. Open to any graduating HS senior planning to major in communications at a four-year college or university. Those individuals selected as finalists will be required to submit a portfolio of their creative work and provide documentation of an SAT score taken before Nov. 5, 2007. **Postmark Deadline: November 5, 2007.** To download application go to http://www.emmyonline.org/foundation/scholarship_application.html

WRITERS OF THE FUTURE/ILLUSTRATORS OF THE FUTURE - No entry fee required. Prizes every three months: \$1,000, \$750, \$500 and an annual Grand Prize of \$5,000. The current contest begins October 1, 2007. All types of science fiction, fantasy and dark fantasy are welcome. To be eligible, entries must be works of prose, up to 17,000 words in length and not poetry or works intended for children. Also check out the Illustrators of the Future Contest (same website).

9th ANNUAL POETRY CONTEST - 9-12 grade. Open to all U.S. high school students. Poems must be 20 lines or less, unpublished, the sole work of the entrant. No entry fee. One entry per contestant. **PRIZES:** The Easterday Poetry Award of a \$1,000.00 college scholarship will be awarded to the American High School Poets, "Poet of the Year." In addition, there will be 1 First Place Winner, 4 Second Place Winners (2 from each contest) and 6 Third Place Winners (3 from each contest). There will also be numerous Honorable Mentions and hundreds of regional and topical winners. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place prizes will be \$500, \$250, and \$100 scholarship prizes respectively. Two contests will be held: **Fall-Winter 2007 – includes all entries postmarked BEFORE October 31, 2007. Spring-Summer 2008 – includes all entries postmarked between Nov. 1, 2007 and March 31, 2008.** You may enter a different poem in each contest. <http://geocities.com/diet-lps/contestrules.html>

Applicants must be enrolled full-time as high school seniors or college undergraduates. The funds will go toward each student's education, with an emphasis on the continuation of their anti-discrimination and social justice work. In 2001, five \$50,000 scholarships will be awarded.
