Mission Statement

Jack and Terry Mannion Middle School is dedicated to creating a safe and challenging environment in which to prepare our middle school students for the academic, behavioral and social demands of their future high school experience.

Principal's Highlights

Our school is a learning community committed to preparing each and every student for further education in high school and beyond by helping them acquire the knowledge and skills they will need.

- Mannion students continued to score at over 75% proficiency on the Nevada Criterion Referenced Tests.
- Outstanding academic programs were offered, including accelerated courses in all core subjects and grades.
- Almost 47% of the student body was enrolled in accelerated classes.
- Slightly over 84% of 8th graders were enrolled in Pre-Algebra or Algebra I Honors, up from 65% the year before.
- Ninety-one percent of Algebra I Honors students and 63% of Pre-Algebra students passed the CCSD semester exam.
- Forty-two percent of the student body made the Honor Roll, 223 students for straight A and 509 students for A/B.
- Two hundred and thirty-nine students were enrolled in the Spanish language immersion program.
- All music groups received superior scores at CCSD festivals and the band led CCSD in members selected for CCSD Honor Band.
- The girl's basketball team were co-champions of our division and made the play-offs.

Per-Pupil Expenditures 2009-2010


Personnel Information

Parent/Community Involvement

Newsletters are developed five times a year as well as specific topic letters (e.g. testing). Bi-monthly, a calendar of events is sent home. Academic progress reports are given to the students monthly. Many parent/counselor/teacher conferences are held throughout the year. The school utilizes the ParentLink communication system to enable parents to access their child's grades and attendance. An-dialer is used to apprise parents of their child's absences and a school website is maintained. Parents are able to communicate with staff through e-mails and phone calls. All teachers are required to provide parents with contact information. Many parents e-mail the principal, other administrators and counselors and this is encouraged. A monthly open meeting is held with parents and the principal, and two sessions are offered for parent convenience. Special events like Open House and the Back to School Fair are held to impart information and give parents a chance to meet and interact with staff. A Career Fair is held each year to involve the community in our school and parent volunteers and chaperones are encouraged. The counseling department also offers many opportunities for evening conferences with parents.
