**APPROVE CELEBRATING CLARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT** (continued)

Mrs. Lea presented the flag designs and styles to the committee.

Mrs. Brager-Wellman inquired about the funding resource associated with the cost of the flags.

Mrs. Haldeman stated that she believed that this money would come from the general fund.

Mrs. Krohn stated that she had spoken with Ms. Miller and that Ms. Miller advised that although it is too late for an addendum to be attached to the agenda, the decisions the committee makes today could be presented to the full board during the presentation item on the agenda, and that if there were any concerns, it could then be placed on a future agenda.

Mrs. Lea explained that the cost would vary depending on many factors, including size, fabric, color, and design. She cautioned that vinyl would only last a year or two; therefore, there may be some replacement costs involved with the use of that fabric.

*Motion to recommend the simple 3X5 flag with nylon and the appliqué to the full board for discussion.*

*Motion: Moulton Second: Brager-Wellman Vote: Unanimous*

The committee recommended that Mrs. Lea do a brief presentation to the full board on October 12, 2006.

Ms. Daellenbach presented a growth chart and explained that they calculated the percent of growth for every subgroup and every school as a whole from last year to this year and counted only those subgroups that were 25 or greater; then they gave the school credit for the number of subgroups that were reported so the schools with the most challenges received credit for that; then they did an overall school average of growth; and then they were divided into three groups.

Mrs. Haldeman asked the committee to consider whether or not they would like the schools to receive two flags when they qualify for two categories such as growth and Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP).

Mrs. Moulton stated that she would like to see the schools have one flag.

Mrs. Brager-Wellman agreed that one flag would be appropriate.

Mrs. Moulton stated that she would like to recognize them for AYP. She stated that 176 schools made AYP, and according to the proposed methodology, an additional 66 schools would receive recognition for growth.

Mrs. Haldeman asked Ms. Daellenbach for a list of schools that are exemplary, high-achieving, and have made AYP; then using the growth chart, a list of schools that are in the top tier, middle tier, and bottom tier.

*Motion to accept the methodology, recognizing AYP schools first and allowing one flag per school.*

*Motion: Moulton Second: Brager-Wellman Vote: Unanimous*

Mrs. Haldeman asked for direction from the committee on the planning of the public recognition ceremony where the flags would be given to the schools. She suggested having a special recognition night at a high school.
