PRESENTATION ABOUT CCSD PARALYMPIC PROGRAM

Bill Eddins, an Adaptive P.E. teacher was introduced to the committee. He gave his own personal history of how he became disabled and how he was able to change his life and become a P.E. teacher.

The central program for CCSD, the Paralympic Sport Club, was explained. Some details include:

- Kids from 4 years old through high school can participate
- Kids must have a 70 or higher IQ
- The program is housed at Rancho HS
- Both indoor and outdoor sports are offered
- Paralympic equipment is available at Rancho HS
- The club meets one Wednesday a month for 9 months

He showed a PowerPoint presentation describing some of the hurdles that students with physical disabilities face with respect to participating in a Physical Education class and how they have been able to adapt various physical activities and sports to accommodate these students. He explained the benefits to students and their families. The PowerPoint ended with a short video showing students participating in sporting events.

A question and answer period followed.

CHAIRPERSON REPORTS

Samantha Wolk reported that she attended both board meetings in April and of interest to her were the bullying policies and Literacy Program.

Dylan did not attend any meetings in April.

ACCESS TO HONORS AND AP COURSES

A discussion included students who are being forced to take AP classes at one school, prices of AP tests, and the various ways schools are trying to have more students take AP/Honors classes in order to ready them for college.

SENIOR YEAR REQUIREMENTS

There was a discussion about the high number of valedictorians per school and how many of them are allowed to speak at graduation. Superintendent Skorkowsky indicated that if the GPA cap was removed, it would eliminate that problem.

Superintendent Skorkowsky said that the Board of Education would propose legislation to waive the 9th grade test. After some discussion about this topic, Superintendent Skorkowsky mentioned that the members might be able to help CCSD testify at the education legislative hearings next year. Several students seemed interested so this topic will be added to the September agenda.

There was a discussion about if 22 ½ credits was enough credits needed to graduate.
