## SECTARIANISM AND RELIGIOUS HOLIDAYS

- No public school funds shall in any way be used to benefit sectarianism. No books or papers of a sectarian or denominational character shall be used in the Clark County School District, and no sectarianism shall be taught or promoted within a school.
- II. Religious holidays may be observed only to the extent that such observances illuminate the customs and traditions of a culture and may not provide opportunities for religious indoctrination. Songs and customs commonly accepted in the American way of life, even though such songs and customs may have been of a religious nature, are considered to be cultural traditions.
- III. Sunday is generally accepted as a day reserved to people for purposes of their own determination and should be considered as a day free from the demands of educational pursuits for District personnel and students.
